# **Parenting Network Handbook 2012**

#### **Foreword**

The Isle of Man Parenting Network was established in February 2009 and set out to improve the coordination of support to parents on the Isle of Man.

The Network has representation from The Children's Centre, the Department of Education and Children, the Department of Health, the Department of Social Care, the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service, the Mothers' Union, Care for the Family, Crossroads Caring for Carers, Autism in Mann, Autism Initiatives and the Isle of Man Adoption and Alcohol Advisory Services. By working together to improve outcomes for parents and children, the Parenting Network Handbook 2012 provides a guide for all parents on the support that is available across the Isle of Man.

A five level approach describes a range of interventions and support strategies available to parents and families.

At **Level 1**, informal support is available to all parents who may wish to chat through certain issues or receive advice on general parenting skills. All parents are likely to need advice and guidance with parenting at some stage - be it from their own family, from their friends or from support groups. At level 1, a range of low level support programmes are described in the Handbook.

At **Levels 2 and, 3,** the Handbook describes a range of additional support that can be made available to ensure that parenting is successful and that parents enjoy a happy and rewarding time with their children at home.

At **Levels 4 and 5**, the Isle of Man has adopted a specialist approach to parenting entitled the 'Triple P' approach (Positive Parenting Programme) and this is designed to offer very clear strategies on how to manage challenging behaviour and restore calm and balance to the child-adult relationships within the home.

Access to the Triple P training is made through a referral system. Referrals can be made through schools, health visitors, GPs, social workers and other professionals.

The IOM Alcohol Advisory Service is a Manx registered charity and has just celebrated its thirtieth year in operation. Its core business is to offer free, confidential support to anyone concerned about their own or someone else's alcohol use. A range of interventions which target those affected have been developed including:

- **Problem drinking:** Assessment/motivational interventions/counselling and support for associated life issues/relapse prevention and aftercare for anyone who has concerns about their drinking.
- Young people: AAS 12-21: A dedicated young person's alcohol service this new innovative service offers guidance to young people experiencing harm through their own alcohol use and for young people affected by parental problem drinking. Our young person's worker uses an assertive outreach approach persisting in gaining and maintaining contact with these affected young people. The hidden harm attributable to alcohol misuse in the family can have a devastating impact on children. They are more likely to have witnessed domestic and other types of violence in the home, suffer from stress and anxiety disorder and to go on and develop alcohol problems themselves. In the first 2 years of operation 240 young people have been referred to this service.
- Family members/significant others: Our philosophy is that everyone
  affected by problem drinking of someone close to them should be entitled to
  support in their own right and not just as an adjunct to the treatment of a
  problem drinker. Family members can suffer from many physical,
  psychological and social difficulties. Counselling and support for significant
  others/family members is offered at the AAS.

In addition the service offers a variety of other initiatives aimed at the wider community:

- Education a peer educator is employed to deliver alcohol education sessions using best practice materials in schools/youth settings and the IOM College.
- Resources/information the service has a range of leaflets, materials available to anyone who wants to know more about alcohol and its related effects
- Training packages using best practice materials training can be tailored for specific groups in the public or private sector; eg Alcohol and the Workplace, Alcohol and the Elderly.

# ISLE OF MAN GOVERNMENT

Several departments of Government are partners in The Isle of Man Parenting Network:

#### **HEALTH**

The purpose of Health Services is -

To enable the people, individually and collectively, to live healthily and fulfill their potential within a secure environment.

The specific Health Services policy objectives are:-

- To maintain and, where necessary, improve the physical and mental health of the people of the Island through prevention and treatment of illness, disease and disability.
- To provide for a comprehensive and readily available range of acute Health Services.
- To provide for a comprehensive and readily available range of Primary Health Care Services,
- To ensure the co-ordinated provision of Health and Social Services.
- To achieve greater awareness of the benefits of a healthy lifestyle.

In order to provide direction to all parties concerned, directly or otherwise, in delivering services which influence the health of the Isle of Man population, the Department has published a Strategy for Health document.

#### **SOCIAL SERVICES**

Social Services is a Division of DSC. It has responsibility to assess the social care needs of the people of the Isle of Man, taking into account their race, culture, special needs and religion. In addition, we aim to contribute to the well being of communities throughout the Island.

We work with other organisations to provide a range of services to meet individual and community needs within the resources available.

The offices are situated in *Murray House*, on the corner of Prospect Hill and Finch Road.

## **EDUCATION AND CHILDREN**

The purpose of the Department is to ensure that the Education Service complements the aims of Government by setting clear policies directly related to Central Government policies.

The Department's General Statement of Policy is as follows:

- To develop further the Isle of Man's reputation for educational excellence.
- To ensure the provision of the educational skills required for the Island to survive, prosper and achieve economic growth in the 21st Century.
- To ensure the delivery of the highest standards of teaching and learning.

- To ensure that each person follows a curriculum appropriate to his/her needs and is encouraged to reach the highest levels of personal attainment.
- To enable individuals and groups to develop their full potential, to become positive and contributing members of society, to show care and tolerance to others, our environment, culture and way of life.
- To maintain services and partnerships which support those delivering education in schools, clubs, the Isle of Man College, Higher Education and the workplace.
- To monitor educational needs and the future demands for education, so as to develop strategies for the optimum provision of staff and premises.

The Department of Education and Children, its various sections, its schools and the Isle of Man College subscribe to one overall aim, which is: "To provide high quality life long learning opportunities for all the people of the Isle of Man so that they can develop to their own potential and are able to contribute fully to society."

#### SERVICES FOR CHILDREN - EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY

The Educational Psychology Service is part of 'Services for Children' in the Department of Education and Children based at Hamilton House, Peel Road, Douglas.

Educational Psychologists are professionally qualified and aim to apply their knowledge of psychology at all levels within the education system, and with other agencies, to ensure that any barriers to learning and development, whether cognitive, social or emotional, are reduced and children and young people's future prospects are enhanced.

To this end, they may consult and work collaboratively with schools to gain a deeper understanding of issues to do with child development and learning differences (autistic spectrum conditions, dyslexia, ADHD) and to create interventions that promote inclusion (managing behaviour, managing anxiety, solution focused therapy).

They may work with individuals, parents and other agencies to assess, advise and support them in their learning and bring about change.

They may also work at a more strategic level, for example, helping the DEC to write policies that ensure that the special educational needs of children and young people on the Island are met and the barriers to learning removed or promoting programmes that protect the emotional health and wellbeing of young people in our schools. The EPS can be accessed by parents/carers through schools. Each school on the Island has an allocated Educational Psychologist. If a parent/carer has any concerns about their child's learning, development, and/or behaviour, the following procedure operates:

- 1. Parents/carers discuss concerns initially with the class or subject teacher
- 2. If further interventions are needed, discussions take place with the class/ teacher or tutor, Head of Year and/or the Special Needs Coordinator (SENCO). Each school has a teacher who has the job of coordinating any special or additional educational needs a child or young person may have in the school.

- If, through discussion, it is felt that it would be helpful to consult with an Educational Psychologist, the SENCO will submit a request for and 'EP Consultation' to the Department. In all but exceptional cases, parental permission is needed for a child or young person to be seen by an Educational Psychologist.
- 4. The school's Educational Psychologist will then liaise with the school and/or parents to plan a way forward.

Pre-school children are referred to the service either (a) via the Pre-school Assessment Centre (b) by Health Professionals or Social Care Services directly to the designated Early Years Educational Psychologist, or (c) by parents through Services for Children.

## THE PRE-SCHOOL ASSESSMENT CENTRE (PSAC)

The Pre School Assessment Centre (PSAC) is part of the Island's Department of Education and Children. It is based at Pulrose Youth and Community Centre, Pulrose, Douglas.

The Staff are professionally trained in all areas of the curriculum to work alongside Speech & Language Therapists, Occupational Therapists, Physiotherapists and most importantly with parents.

The Centre promotes inclusion, reduces barriers to learning and supports schools in meeting special needs.

If children are to progress their needs have to be understood and each child must be appreciated for their own unique personality and development. The aim at PSAC is to maximize a child's strengths by adapting the environment and the people around them.

PSAC uses a coherent and consistent multi disciplinary learning programme emphasizing the physical, emotional, social and cognitive development so that children can gain confidence and competence so they can work with their peer group and achieve as independent a life as possible.

### THE CHILD AND ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE (CAMHS)

The Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS) is a specialist multi disciplinary team who work with children and young people who are experiencing emotional, behavioural, and mental health problems.

CAMHS currently accepts referrals for children and young people up to their 16<sup>th</sup> birthday.

As a specialist CAMHS, predominantly operating at Tier 3, we aim to address the needs of children and young people presenting with mental health disorder, and their families/carers, by:

Helping to develop problem–solving skills.

- Increasing parents' and carers' ability to manage existing psychological problems more effectively.
- Enhancing children and young people's coping abilities.
- Having a positive impact on the child or young person's resilience to assist them to manage negative stressors more effectively.

Each team member has a specific role / speciality within the team, ensuring that a wide range of interventions can be offered to the client group. The exchange of knowledge and skills is also fostered amongst team members.

#### Referral Criteria

Whilst not intended to be exhaustive, these are the main mental health disorders which may require assessment and intervention from CAMHS:

- Conduct or oppositional defiant disorder
- Anxiety
- Phobias
- Attachment disorders
- Depression
- Obsessional and/or compulsive disorders
- Psychosis
- Anorexia and other eating disorders

- Deliberate self–harm
- Neuro-developmental disorders, e.g. Attention Deficit Hyperactive Disorder (ADHD), Tourette's Syndrome
- Somatic disorders
- Adjustment disorders
- Chronic illness with evidence of mental health co-morbidity

Referrals are accepted from any other professional who works with children and young people. We are not able to accept referrals from children and young people themselves or from parents.

CAMHS exclusion criteria includes anyone over the age of 16 at the point of referral and anyone whose difficulties do not warrant tier 2 or tier 3 services.



Crossroads Caring for Carers is a Manx charity established in 1988 to provide respite to carers and services to those with care needs. Crossroads Isle of Man is a network member of the Princess Royal Trust for Carers. The organisation currently provides a diverse range of services to all ages and care needs with the long term

goal of providing sustainable respite to family members who look after them, whilst promoting the individual's self sufficiency.
