KAJO-KEJI in SOUTH SUDAN

KAJO-KEJI in SOUTH SUDAN

Kajo-Keji is located in South Sudan, close to the Ugandan border. As we know, war has been raging in South Sudan since 2013, not long after it became independent from Sudan in 2011. Unfortunately, in January 2017, the war reached Kajo-Keji, and people fled to the neighbourhood country, Uganda, which opened its doors.

In 2018, some of us were fortunate to go and visit the refugee camps in Northern Uganda and meet our MU links, with Mama Cicilia, President of the MU Diocese, her husband Bishop Emmanuel, and many of the Mothers' Union workers. We attended their MU Conference, and prayed that they would soon be able to return home, their Promised Land. For this, many are still waiting.

Indeed, a radio broadcast from early February 2022, describes how, in Kajo-Keji, cattle herders from neighbouring states are still bringing truck loads of cattle to graze on the land of the Kajo-Keji people, so that the latter cannot farm the land. The invaders cut the trees and take them away for timber. The cattle farmers are accompanied by soldiers and they pillage homes and kill families . Consequently, many Kajo-Keji people prefer to stay in the camps, fearing for their lives and waiting for better times .

The Mothers' Union team, led by Mama Cicilia (President) and Silvian Kiden (the MU leader) are continuing their pastoral ministry, both in the camps and in Kajo-Keji. They preach the good news of Christ and prepare people for confirmation.

At Christmas, Bishop Emmanuel was able to celebrate Christ's birth in the Cathedral of Kajo-Keji, where he is now based. Sadly, in early February, Bishop Emmanuel lost his father. We remember him and his father in our prayers.

Light the first candle and place the flag of South Sudan in the appropriate place.

Lord, we pray for the people of Kajo-Keji, as they still struggle to make a living, in the camps as well as in Kajo-Keji itself. Bless them all, and give them hope, patience, and strength as they wait for the departure of the people who took over their land and left their cattle there. Give strength to the Mothers' Union members, Lord, as they go around evangelising, preaching the good news of Christ, dead and risen, and bringing people to baptism and confirmation.

Lord, be with Bishop Emmanuel as he mourns the death of his father, and welcome his Dad into your Kingdom.

DUTSE in NIGERIA

DUTSE in NIGERIA

The Diocese of Dutse is located in the Northern part of Nigeria, and is an enclave of Christianity in a large Moslem area. The Diocese has a population of about 1000 people, clergymen, men, women, youth and children included. The Mother's Union President is Mrs. Danbinta, wife of Bishop Markus Danbinta.

Life is tough in the Dutse Diocese as no one knows what will happen in the next moment. Mr. and Mrs Uche, a family in the Diocese, lost their four children in an accident this January. Also in January, the Bishop's son was ambushed. Fortunately he survived, but his motorcycle was stolen. Despite all the insecurity and the threat of being killed, at the end of January the Mothers' Union held their annual Conference, followed by a rededication service. Then, they held a revival meeting entitled Surpassing measure of God's grace over sorrow.

MU Dutse are praying for a breakthrough in their finances in order to get land to build a vocational centre. But mostly, they ask us to pray for divine intervention as their country is "decaying morally and spiritually, and there is no sacredness of life".

Light the second candle and place a Nigerian flag in northern Nigeria.

Lord, be with all the people of the Dutse Diocese as they experience daily conflicts, daily killings, daily threats. Give them strength and courage to take each day as it comes. Walk with each one of them as they struggle to face all their problems. Lord, be with Mr. and Mrs. Uche as they mourn the sudden death of their four children. Welcome the children in your paradise, and uphold the parents in your comforting arms.

Lord, as the Mothers' Union struggle on, give them grace to overcome the obstacles on their path, and help them continue in their evangelism tasks. Guide them as they fight evil, and encourage them to rekindle the flame of light through their love of God and one another.

AKOKO-EDO in NIGERIA

The Diocese of Akoko-Edo is located in the Southern part of Nigeria. It was started in 2007 in the Edo State of Nigeria. The Mothers' Union President is Victoria Oyekpen, wife of Bishop Oyekpen.

Last April the Bishop and Mrs Oyekpen celebrated their 25th wedding anniversary and their 50th birthdays in a lavish and colourful celebration.

Mothers' Union members are very involved in the community, taking care of families in need. For couples who wish to affirm their Christian commitments but cannot afford a Church wedding, MU organises "marriage blessings" in church, making families full members of the Church community and women are then able to join Mothers' Union. Unfortunately their membership is not as large as they would want it to be, and they ask us to pray for an increase. Their MU conference is held each year in February, in the cathedral. Their main problem at the moment is the terrible state of their roads which hinders their programmes.

MU are also very keen to protect girls from under-age marriages and to keep them in the faith. To this effect they are sponsoring girls' fellowship programmes, with cultural and recreational activities. In addition to the Girls' Guild, they inaugurated the Girls' Brigade in April 2020. They are currently preparing three new companies for enrolment.

AKOKO-EDO in NIGERIA

Light the third candle and place another Nigerian flag in the south of Nigeria.

Lord, we thank you for the wonderful work of the Mothers' Union in the Diocese of Akoko-Edo. Bless the Bishop and his wife, Victoria, as they continue their ministry following the great celebration of their 25th wedding anniversary. Give them strength as they lead the Diocese with enthusiasm and faith.

Bless the work of the Mothers' Union as they strive to increase their membership. Help them bring girls and women to the faith through the Girls' Brigade, the Girls' Guild, and the blessings in Church of marriages performed according to local customs.

Lord remember the people of Akoko-Edo and protect them as they go around the Diocese on very bad and dangerous roads.

We thank you that we have a new venue for this summer's Away From it All holidays.

We pray for the team, our fundraising and that the families you chose will be invited.
