St Cosmus and St Damian in the Blean Mothers' Union Fellowship News from Madagascar



Our church's link with Revd Olivier Rajarison in Ambatondrazaka began in 2008.
Since then Revd Olivier has founded four

more churches. Judy Keay was one of our members who visited

Ambatondrazaka in 2018, and since then she has maintained contact with Revd Olivier's wife, Zo. The following is an up-date of some of the progress being made:





There has been an increase in the fields of vegetables, especially Saonjo (cassava family), which contributes to healthy living.
One of the MU members has managed to purchase a pig, and once it produces piglets, will share with the others.

The sewing machines which Blean funded are being used to make mosquito nets.

Claire, an MU member in Mahatsinjo now weighs all new babies at birth and if below weight, ensures a feeding programme is in place for the mother and baby. These are encouraging signs of one of the messages the team tried to impart during the 2018 visit, that God uses our hands, feet etc.

At the Lambeth Conference last year Judy met Neny Tantely, wife of the Bishop of Antananarivo. Neny remarked it was pleasing to meet someone from Blean, since Judy visited her and Bishop John during the 2018 visit in Madagascar. Zo and Neny have met since.

Earlier this year Revd Olivier's home was burgled and amongst the items stolen was his computer. Fortunately none of the family were harmed. Since communication between us is largely by email, it was decided to fund a replacement computer, and happily communication is restored.

Sandra Goodey - Trustee


As you all know, on August 9th each year we remember and celebrate the obedience and vision of Mary Sumner. Her most famous prayer is so simple, yet profound

All this day, O Lord, let me touch as many lives as possible for thee; and every life I touch, do thou by thy spirit quicken, whether through the word I speak, the prayer I breathe, or the life I live.

It is something we would do well to pray daily, as the first line suggests. It got me thinking about other christians whose lives we remember in the lectionary throughout the year. So I have picked a few whose days fall between now and November, choosing some of their prayers that can give us some fresh ideas for our daily prayer life as we ask God to bless us and the work of the Mothers' Union across the world

Saint Augustine - August 28th He wrote many prayers but this poetic prayer to the Holy Spirit echoes much of what Mary Sumner wrote and reminds us that the Holy Spirit will strengthen and protect us


Breathe in me, O Holy Spirit, That my thoughts may all be holy. Act in me, O Holy Spirit, That my work, too, may be holy. Draw my heart, O Holy Spirit, That I love but what is holy. Strengthen me, O Holy Spirit, To defend all that is holy. Guard me, then, O Holy Spirit, That I always may be holy.



SEPTEMBER

John Chrysostom 13th September

His prayer at the end of Evensong is well known but I was delighted to find many "arrow" prayers which are attributed to St. John Chrysostom. The description arrow prayers refers to short, frequent thoughts that we direct to God, as a reminder that we are constantly in his presence, and to call down his grace.



Here are eight:

- O Lord, enlighten my heart that evil desires have darkened.
- O Lord, send down Thy grace to help me, that I may glorify Thy name.
- O Lord Jesus Christ, write me in the book of life and grant unto me a good end.
- O Lord, sprinkle into my heart the dew of Thy grace.
- O Lord, quicken in me a good thought.
- O Lord, give me tears and remembrance of death, and contrition.
- O Lord, implant in me the root of all good: Thy fear in my heart.
- O Lord, grant that I may love Thee from all my soul and mind, and in everything do Thy will

OCTOBER

October 11th St Ethelburga



St Ethelburga, (died 675) Having refused an arranged marriage to a pagan prince, she was banished to a nunnery by her brother, She proved to be a natural leader and became the first Abbess of the great Benedictine Abbey at Barking in Essex, one of the first religious houses for women in the country. She is especially noted for her heroic conduct in caring for the sick during an outbreak of the plague in 664 which eventually killed her and most of her community. During this time she is said to have had a vision of a light "brighter than the sun at noonday" which inspired her and her community to carry out works of great compassion in caring for others. She epitomises a strong woman who exemplifies the virtues of leadership and commitment to social action even to the point of self-sacrifice. St Ethelburga's Centre in London is a focus for reconciliation and ecology - bringing peace to both people and our planet. Here is one of their prayers

God of life, Every act of violence in our world, between myself and another, destroys a part of your creation. Stir in my heart a renewed sense of reverence for all life. Give me the vision to recognise your spirit in every human being, however they behave towards me. Make possible the impossible by cultivating in me the fertile seed of healing love. May I play my part in breaking the cycle of violence by realising that peace begins with me.

NOVEMBER

November 6 William Temple Archbishop of Canterbury

His oft quoted

"The Church is the only society that exists for the benefit of those who are not its members, is well known.

However I also was most encouraged by these two quotes and the following prayer of William Temple:"

"My worth is what I am worth to God; and that is a great deal, for Christ died for me."



O God of love, we pray thee to give us love:

Love in our thinking, love in our speaking,
Love in our doing, and love in the hidden places of our souls;
Love of our neighbours near and far;
Love of our friends, old and new;
Love of those with whom we find it hard to bear,
And love of those who find it hard to bear with us;
Love of those with whom we work,
And love of those with whom we take our ease;
Love in Joy, love in sorrow; Love in life and love in death;
That so at length we may be worthy to dwell with thee,
Who art eternal love.

It's one of the largest textile art projects by a single artist, ever. Jacqui Parkinson has a national reputation for large scale work – this is touring twenty cathedrals. She spent three years on the panels, using miles of thread - and eight million stitches!
